EPISTLE

The Reading from the Second Catholic Epistle of the Holy Apostle Peter.

Ye Brethren: Be more zealous to confirm your call and election, for if you do this you will never fall; so there will be richly provided for you an entrance into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Therefore I intend always to remind you of these things, though you know them and are established in the truth that you have. I think it right, as long as I am in this body, to arouse you by way of reminder, since I know that the putting off of my body will be soon, as our Lord Jesus Christ showed me. And I will see to it that after my departure you may be able at any time to recall these things. For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. For when he received honour and glory from God the Father and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased," we heard this voice borne from heaven, for we were with him on the holy mountain. And we have the prophetic word made more sure. You will do well to pay attention to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.

AFTER THE PRAYER BEHIND THE AMBON

A table is placed in the middle of the church, with a bowl of grapes on it. Preceded by the Servers carrying the censer, a candle, and the Holy Water vat, the Priest goes out of the Altar through the Royal Doors, to the West side of the table. While the Choir sings the **Troparion of the Transfiguration** [White Book page 118] **Glory** ... **Both now**, and the **Kontakion of the Transfiguration** [White Book page 120], the Priest, with a server carrying a candle facing him, censes around the table three times, The Priest says the Prayer for the Blessing of the Grapes, and sprinkles them with Holy Water. The Liturgy concludes with **Blessed be the Name of the Lord** ...
