Sung on Sunday 17th March 2024 for Monday 18th March 2024 Repose of Saint Nikolaj (Velimirović), Bishop of Žiča

Parts of the service which are read or sung by the priest are shown in red. These are omitted if the service is used without a priest.

If you are serving Vespers at home without a priest, follow the marked sections shown in blue. The 'Reader' may be the most senior person present – e.g. a parent or grandparent, according to the situation – or simply the most confident reader or singer. The parts marked for the 'Choir' can be read or sung by everyone together, or by one person alone.

You may prefer to use parts of the service in your own language. If so, please make sure that the prayers are read from an Orthodox prayer book or service book.

Before the Service

If you are serving Vespers at home, you should do so in front of the household icons – e.g. in the family icon corner. If you have charcoal and incense, you may wish to light the charcoal before the service begins; you can then place incense on the lit charcoal during the hymn **Lord I call** at the words "Let my prayer arise". You may wish to prepare an **unlit** lamp or candle(s) which can be lit when the hymn **O Gladsome Light** is sung.

THE PRAYER OF SAINT EPHRAIM THE SYRIAN

The Priest or Reader says the Prayer of Saint Ephraim:

O Lord and Master of my life, take from me the spirit of sloth, faint-heartedness, lust of power, and idle talk. *(All make a prostration)*

But give rather the spirit of chastity, humility, patience, and love to me Thy servant. *(All make a prostration)*

Yea, O Lord and King, grant me to see my own faults, and not to judge my brother; for blessed art Thou, unto ages of ages. Amen. (All make a prostration)

Priest: Glory to Thee, O Christ our God and our Hope, glory to Thee!

Choir: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, both now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

Father, give the blessing.

The Priest gives the blessing.

Bless, O Lord.

Reader: Lord Jesus Christ, through the intercessions of Thy most pure Mother; by the protection of the honourable bodiless powers of heaven; at the supplications of our Father among the Saints, Chad, Bishop of Lichfield, Patron and Protector of this Community; of the Holy and Righteous Ancestors of God, Joachim and Anna; and of all the saints, have mercy upon us and save us. Amen.

THE CEREMONY OF MUTUAL FORGIVENESS

All venerate the icon of Christ. Each person then makes a prostration in front of each other person present, and asks his or her forgiveness, using these or similar words: **Forgive me, and pray for me, a sinner.** They then share a kiss of peace.

If no one else is present, and you are using the service alone, you should still forgive from your heart anyone who has wronged you, ask God's forgiveness for any wrong you have done to another, and pray for everyone with whom you need to be reconciled because of past wrongs done to one another. You may wish to say the Prayer of Forgiveness: O God, remit, pardon and forgive our sins, whether voluntary or involuntary, whether by words or deeds, whether in knowledge or ignorance, whether by day or night, whether in mind or thought; forgive us all these, for Thou art good and lovest mankind.

Priest/Reader: Through the prayers of our Holy Fathers, Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy upon us, and save us. Amen.
