Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! Re<u>ceive</u> the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, <u>when</u> I call up<u>on</u> Thee!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

<u>Let my prayer</u> arise in Thy <u>sight</u> as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>eve</u>ning <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.

Tone 7 (For the Resurrection)

<u>Come</u>, let us rejoice in the Lord, Who de<u>stroyed</u> the do<u>min</u>ion of death! Let us <u>sing</u> to Him with the <u>bod</u>iless hosts, for He en<u>light</u>ened the <u>race</u> of man!// O our Maker and <u>Saviour</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!

The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

Thou didst en<u>dure</u> the Cross and <u>bur</u>ial for our sake. By Thy <u>death</u>, Thou didst destroy <u>death</u> as God. We fall <u>down</u> before Thy Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day,// O <u>Saviour</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!

Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

When the A<u>pos</u>tles beheld the Resurrection of the <u>Mak</u>er, they were a<u>mazed</u> and sang the an<u>gel</u>ic praise. <u>This</u> is the <u>glory</u> of the Church. <u>This</u> is the richness of the <u>King</u>dom.// O Lord, crucified for our <u>sake</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!

Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Thou wast <u>held</u> by lawless <u>men</u>, O Christ, but to <u>me</u>, Thou art God, and I am <u>not</u> ashamed. Thou wast <u>smit</u>ten on the cheek, but I do not de<u>ny</u> Thee. Thou wast <u>nailed</u> to the Cross and I do not con<u>ceal</u> it, for I <u>glory</u> in Thy Resurrection: Thy <u>death</u> is my life.// O almighty Lord and Lover of <u>man</u>, <u>glory</u> to Thee!

If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.

Tone 1 (For the Feast)

<u>Sim</u>eon, tell us, Whom dost thou <u>bear</u> in thine arms, that thou dost rejoice so greatly in the <u>Temple?</u> To <u>Whom</u> dost thou shout and <u>cry</u> aloud: Now am I set free, for I have <u>seen</u> my <u>Saviour</u>?" This is <u>He</u> Who was born of a <u>Virgin</u>; this is God the Word, Who came <u>forth</u> from God, Who for our <u>sakes</u> has taken flesh and has <u>saved</u> man.// Let us <u>wor</u>ship Him! For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Repeat: Simeon, tell us ...

From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

<u>Sim</u>eon, receive Him Whom Moses once beheld in <u>dark</u>ness, granting the Law on <u>Si</u>nai, now that <u>He</u> has become a Babe <u>subject</u> to the Law! This is <u>He</u> Who <u>spoke</u> through the Law. This is <u>He</u>, of Whom the <u>Proph</u>ets spoke, Who for our sakes has taken flesh and has <u>saved</u> man.// Let us <u>wor</u>ship Him!

For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Repeat: Simeon, receive Him ...

Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

<u>Come</u>, let us also go to meet Christ with di<u>vine</u> songs! Let us receive Him Whose salvation <u>Sim</u>eon saw! This is <u>He</u> Whom <u>Dav</u>id announced; this is He Who <u>spoke</u> in the <u>Proph</u>ets, <u>Who</u>, for our sakes, has taken flesh and Who <u>speaks</u> through the Law.// Let us <u>wor</u>ship Him!

For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Repeat: Come, let us also go to meet Christ ...

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 6 (For the Feast)

Let the gate of heaven be <u>op</u>ened today, for the unoriginate Word of the <u>Fa</u>ther has made a beginning in time without forsaking His di<u>vin</u>ity. As a Babe <u>for</u>ty days old, of His own will He is brought by the Virgin, His <u>Moth</u>er, as an offering in the <u>Tem</u>ple of the Law. The Elder re<u>ceives</u> Him in his arms, crying as a servant to his <u>Mas</u>ter: "Let me depart, for mine eyes have seen Thy sal<u>va</u>tion!"// Glory to Thee, O Lord, for Thou hast come into the world to <u>save</u> mankind!

OLD TESTAMENT READINGS

The Reading from the Book of Exodus.

The Lord spoke to Moses in that very day on which He led the children of Israel out from the land of Egypt saying: "Sanctify to Me all the first-born, the first-produced opening the womb among the children of Israel." And Moses went and gathered all the people and said: "Remember this day, in which you came out from the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage, for with a strong hand the Lord led you out from thence; and you shall keep His law. And it shall come to pass when the Lord your God shall bring you into the land of the Canaanites, as He swore to your fathers: you shall set apart all the first-born, whatever opens the womb, the males for the Lord. And it shall come to pass that if thy son asks thee, saying, "What is this?" thou shalt say to him: "By strength of hand the Lord led thee out of the land Egypt, out of the house of bondage. For when Pharaoh hardened his heart, so as not to let us go, the Lord slew all the first-born in the land of Egypt, both the first-born of man and the first-born of cattle. Therefore, I bring a sacrifice to the Lord: every male that opens the womb; but all the first-born

of my sons I will redeem." And it shall be for a sign, set firmly before your eyes. For thus saith the Lord God Almighty: "The first-born of your sons you shall give to Me. And it shall be that a woman who bears a male child, on the eighth day shall circumcise the flesh of his foreskin. Then for thirty-three days she shall not enter into the sanctuary of God to the priest until the days of purification are fulfilled. "And after this she shall bring to the Lord an unblemished lamb one year old, as a whole-burnt offering, and a young pigeon or a turtledove, to the doors of the tent of witness, to the priest. Or, instead of these she shall bring before the Lord two turtledoves or two young pigeons, and the priest shall pray for her. "For these are given to Me as a recompense from all the sons of Israel, and I have taken them and consecrated them for Myself, instead of the first-born of the Egyptians, in the day in which I slew all the first-born in the land of Egypt, of both man and cattle." Thus saith God Most High, the Holy One of Israel. [Exodus 12:51-13:3; Leviticus 12:2-7, Numbers 8:16-17]

The reading from the Prophecy of Isaiah.

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up. The house was full of His glory. Around Him stood seraphim; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one cried to another and said, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory." The lintel was lifted up by the voice of those who cried out, and the house was filled with smoke. So I said, "Woe is me, because I am pierced to the heart, for being a man and having unclean lips, I dwell in the midst of a people with unclean lips; for I saw the King, the Lord of hosts, with my eyes!" Then one of the seraphim was sent to me. He had a live coal in his hand, which he took with tongs from the altar. He touched my mouth, and said, "Behold, this has touched your lips. Your lawlessness is taken away, and your sin is cleansed." I also heard the voice of the Lord, saving, "Whom shall I send, and who will go to this people?" Then I said, "Behold, here am I, send me." So He said, "Go, and tell this people, 'You shall hear indeed, but not understand; and you shall see indeed, but not perceive.' For the heart of this people has become insensitive, and their ears hear with difficulty. They have closed their eyes, lest they should see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and return, and I should heal them." Then I said, "Lord, how long?" So He answered, "Until the cities are laid waste and without inhabitant, the houses are without people, and the land shall be left desolate. After this God will remove the people far away, and those left in the land shall multiply." [Isaiah 6:1-12]

The Reading from the Prophecy of Isaiah.

Behold, the Lord sitteth on a light cloud, and shall come to Egypt; and the idols of Egypt will tremble at His presence, and their hearts shall faint within them. And their spirit shall be troubled within them, and He will frustrate their counsel. He will deliver Egypt into the hands of cruel lords ... Thus saith the Lord, the Holy Lord of Hosts! And the Egyptians shall drink the water that is by the sea, but will fail and be dried up. Thus saith the Lord: Where now are your wise men? Let them tell you and make known what the Lord of Hosts has purposed against Egypt. In that day the Egyptians will be in fear and trembling because of the hand of the Lord of Hosts which He shall lay upon them. And there shall be an altar to the Lord in the land of the Egyptians, and a pillar to the Lord at its border. And it shall be a sign to the Lord of Hosts forever in the land of the Egyptians; for they shall cry to the Lord and the Lord shall send to them a man who shall save them. And the Lord will make Himself known to the Egyptians, and the Egyptians shall know the Lord in that day, and they shall offer sacrifices and gifts, and shall pray, and make their vows unto the Lord. [Isaiah 19:1, 3, 4-5, 12, 16, 19-21]

As the <u>Saviour</u> of the world Thou didst a<u>rise</u> from the tomb. As <u>God</u> Thou didst resurrect the race of <u>man</u> with Thy flesh.// O <u>Lord</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

<u>Come</u>, let us worship the One Who <u>rose</u> from the dead, and en<u>light</u>ened all cre<u>a</u>tion! By His <u>death</u>, He saved us from the <u>tor</u>ments of hell.// By His Resurrection He has granted us eternal <u>life</u> and great <u>mer</u>cy.

Tone 8 (For the Feast)

He Who is borne on high by the Cherubim and praised in hymns by the Seraphim is brought today according to the Law into the holy Temple and rests in the arms of the Elder as on a throne. From Joseph He receives gifts <u>fitting</u> for God: a pair of doves, a <u>sym</u>bol of the <u>spot</u>less Church and of the newly chosen people of the Gentiles, and two young pigeons, for He is the originator of the two <u>Cov</u>enants, both <u>Old</u> and New. Simeon, now granted the fulfilment of the prophesies concerning himself, blesses the Virgin and Theotokos Mary. He foretells in figures the Passion of her Son. From Him he begs release, crying aloud: "Now. Master, let me depart as Thou hast promised me, for I have seen the pre-eternal Light// and the Lord and Saviour of the people who bear the Name of Christ!"

By Thy Cross Thou didst destroy death. To the thief Thou didst open Paradise. For the Myrrhbearers Thou didst change weeping into joy, and Thou didst command Thy disciples, O Christ God, to proclaim that Thou art risen,// granting the world great mercy.
