Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.

Tone 2 (For the Resurrection)

Come, let us worship the <u>Word</u> of God begotten of the Father before all <u>ages</u>, and in<u>car</u>nate of the Virgin <u>Mary</u>! Having en<u>dured</u> the Cross, He was buried as He Him<u>self</u> desired.// And having risen from the dead, He saved me, an <u>er</u>ring man.

Every man will stand in <u>fear</u> before Thee, trembling at the river of fire flowing <u>past</u> Thy throne, as each one waits to hear the <u>sen</u>tence he deserves. On that awesome day have mercy on us as <u>well</u>, O Christ; count us worthy of sal<u>va</u>tion, for, worthless as we are, we turn to <u>Thee</u> in faith,// O compassionate and <u>mer</u>ciful Lord!

Tone 2 (Theotokion – Dogmatikon)
