Tone 8 <u>Lord</u>, I call upon Thee, <u>hear me!</u> <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord! Lord, I call up<u>on</u> Thee, <u>hear me!</u> Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> up<u>on</u> Thee!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>in</u>cense, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of <u>my</u> hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.

Tone 8 (For the Resurrection)

We <u>offer</u> to <u>Thee</u>, 0 Christ, our evening song and reasonable <u>ser</u>vice, for Thou didst <u>will</u> to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

Lord, <u>Lord</u>, do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Thy face! For Thou didst will to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Rejoice, O holy <u>Zi</u>on: Mother of the churches, the a<u>bode</u> of God, for thou wast the first to re<u>ceive</u> re<u>mis</u>sion of sins// by the Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Tone 1 (From the Lenten Triodion) <u>Broth</u>ers, let us not pray like the <u>Phar</u>isee! He who exalts himself will be <u>hum</u>bled. Let us pre<u>pare</u> to abase ourselves by <u>fast</u>ing; let us cry aloud with the <u>voice</u> of the <u>Pub</u>lican:// "O God, forgive us <u>sin</u>ners!" *If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.*

Repeat: <u>Broth</u>ers, let us not pray like the <u>Phar</u>isee!

For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

The <u>Phar</u>isee went up to the temple with a proud and <u>emp</u>ty heart; the Publican bowed himself in re<u>pent</u>ance. They <u>both</u> stood before Thee, O <u>Mas</u>ter: the one, through <u>boast</u>ing, <u>lost</u> his reward, but the <u>oth</u>er, with tears and sighs, won Thy <u>bless</u>ing: Strengthen me, O Christ our God, as I weep in Thy <u>pres</u>ence,// since Thou art the <u>Lov</u>er of man! From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 1 (For the Meeting of Our Lord)

<u>Sim</u>eon, tell us, Whom dost thou <u>bear</u> in thine arms, that thou dost rejoice so greatly in the <u>Tem</u>ple? To <u>Whom</u> dost thou shout and <u>cry</u> aloud: "Now am I set free, for I have <u>seen</u> my <u>Saviour</u>?" This is <u>He</u> Who was born of a <u>Vir</u>gin; this is God the Word, Who came <u>forth</u> from God, Who for our <u>sakes</u> has taken flesh and has <u>saved</u> man.// Let us <u>wor</u>ship Him!

For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

<u>Sim</u>eon, receive Him Whom Moses once beheld in <u>dark</u>ness, granting the Law on <u>Si</u>nai, now that <u>He</u> has become a Babe <u>subject</u> to the Law! This is <u>He</u> Who <u>spoke</u> through the Law. This is <u>He</u>, of Whom the <u>Proph</u>ets spoke, Who for our sakes has taken flesh and has <u>saved</u> man.// Let us <u>wor</u>ship Him!

Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

<u>Come</u>, let us also go to meet Christ with di<u>vine</u> songs! Let us receive Him Whose salvation <u>Sim</u>eon saw! This is <u>He</u> Whom <u>Dav</u>id announced; this is He Who <u>spoke</u> in the <u>Proph</u>ets, <u>Who</u>, for our sakes, has taken flesh and Who <u>speaks</u> through the Law.// Let us <u>wor</u>ship Him!

For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Tone 6 (For the Meeting of Our Lord)

Let the gate of heaven be <u>op</u>ened today, for the unoriginate Word of the <u>Fa</u>ther has made a beginning in time without forsaking His di<u>vin</u>ity. As a Babe <u>for</u>ty days old, of His own will He is brought by the Virgin, His <u>Moth</u>er, as an offering in the <u>Tem</u>ple of the Law. The Elder re<u>ceives</u> Him in his arms, crying as a servant to his <u>Mas</u>ter: "Let me depart, for mine eyes have seen Thy sal<u>va</u>tion!"// Glory to Thee, O Lord, for Thou hast come into the world to <u>save</u> mankind!

Tone 8 (From the Lenten Triodion)

I <u>know</u> the value of tears, O al<u>mighty</u> Lord: they delivered Hezekiah from the <u>gates</u> of death, and rescued the <u>har</u>lot from re<u>peat</u>ed sins. Tears justified the Publican instead of the <u>Phar</u>isee. I <u>pray</u> Thee, O Lord:// "Number me with the former, and have <u>mer</u>cy on me!"

Now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 (Theotokion – Dogmatikon)

The <u>King</u> of heaven, because of His <u>love</u> for man, appeared on earth and <u>dwelt</u> with men. He took <u>flesh</u> from the pure <u>Virg</u>in and after assuming it, He came <u>forth</u> from her. The Son is one: in two natures, yet one <u>Per</u>son. Proclaiming Him as perfect <u>God</u> and <u>per</u>fect Man, we confess <u>Christ</u> our God!// Entreat Him, O unwedded Mother, to have <u>mer</u>cy on our souls.

His most pure soul descended to <u>hell</u>, which He spoiled. His holy body did not see cor<u>rup</u>tion in the tomb.// He is the Re<u>deem</u>er of our souls.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

In <u>psalms</u> and songs we glorify Thy Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, O Christ. By it, Thou hast freed us from the <u>tor</u>tures of hell// and as God hast granted eternal life and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Thy house, O Lord, forevermore!

O <u>Mas</u>ter of all, incomprehensible Creator of <u>heav</u>en and earth, by Thy suffering on the Cross Thou hast gained <u>pas</u>sionlessness for me. Accepting burial and a<u>ris</u>ing in <u>glo</u>ry, Thou didst resurrect Adam with Thyself by Thine al<u>mighty</u> hand. Glory to Thy rising on the <u>third</u> day! Tone 8 *(For the Meeting of Our Lord))* <u>He</u> Who is borne on high by the <u>Cher</u>ubim and praised in hymns by the <u>Ser</u>aphim is brought today according to the Law into the <u>holy Tem</u>ple and rests in the arms of the <u>Eld</u>er as on a throne. From Joseph He receives gifts <u>fitting</u> for God: a pair of doves, a symbol of the spotless Church and of the newly chosen people of the Gentiles, and two young pigeons, for He is the originator of the two <u>Cov</u>enants, both <u>Old</u> and New. Simeon, now granted the fulfilment of the prophesies concerning himself, blesses the Virgin and Theotokos Mary. He foretells in figures the Passion of her Son.
