At the beginning:

Choir: Amen.
Priest: Christ is risen from the dead ... (3½ times: English, Greek, Church Slavonic, Romanian)
Choir: ... Şi celor din morminte viaţa dăruindu-le!

The Reader continues the Trisagion Prayers: "Glory to the Father ..." "All Holy Trinity ..." etc.

PSALM103

"LORD, I CALL ..." Tone 1 Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon Thee!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.

Tone 1

The <u>doors</u> being shut and the Disciples as<u>sem</u>bled, Thou didst appear to them as almighty, O <u>Je</u>sus our God. Thou didst <u>stand</u> in their midst, <u>giving</u> them peace, and didst grant the <u>Holy Spir</u>it to them, com<u>mand</u>ing them to wait in Je<u>ru</u>salem until they should be clothed with the <u>pow</u>er from on high. <u>There</u>fore we <u>cry</u> to Thee:// "O our Illumination and Resurrection and Peace, <u>glory</u> to Thee!"

The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

Repeat: "The doors being shut ..."

Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

<u>Eight</u> days after Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord, Thou camest to Thine A<u>pos</u>tles pro<u>claim</u>ing: "<u>Peace</u> be with you all!" To the doubting Disciple, Thou didst <u>show</u> Thy <u>hands</u> and side. He be<u>lieved</u> and <u>cried</u> to Thee:// "My Lord and my God, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!"

Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Repeat: "Eight days after ..."

If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.

<u>Thom</u>as, called the Twin, was not with the Dis<u>ci</u>ples, O Christ, when Thou camest to them through <u>closed</u> doors. <u>There</u>fore he <u>doubt</u>ed their word. Thou didst not reject him for his <u>faith</u>lessness. When he <u>saw</u> Thy side and the wounds in Thy <u>hands</u> and feet, his faith was made <u>cer</u>tain. Having <u>touched</u> and <u>seen</u>, he confessed Thee to be truly <u>God</u>, not <u>on</u>ly man,// crying: "My Lord and my God, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!"

For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Repeat: "Thomas, called the Twin ..."

From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The Dis<u>ci</u>ples were assembled on the <u>eighth</u> day, and the Saviour ap<u>peared</u> to them. He <u>gave</u> them peace and said to <u>Thom</u>as: "Come, O Apostle! Feel My <u>hands</u>, which were <u>pierced</u> by the nails!" O most <u>won</u>derful doubt of <u>Thom</u>as! It brought the hearts of the faithful to <u>know</u>ledge.// And with fear he cried: "My Lord and my God, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!"

For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Repeat: "The Disciples were assembled ..."

Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Tone 2

After Thy <u>ris</u>ing, O Lord, though the <u>doors</u> were shut, Thou didst <u>come</u> to Thine assembled Dis<u>ciples</u>, and didst <u>grant</u> them peace. Even Thomas believed, seeing Thy <u>hands</u> and side; and he con<u>fessed</u> Thee as <u>Lord</u> and God,// Who savest those who hope in Thee, O <u>Lov</u>er of man!

For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

When the <u>doors</u> were shut, Jesus stood in the midst of His Dis<u>ciples</u>. He <u>calmed</u> their hearts and <u>grant</u>ed them peace. Then He spoke to the Apostle <u>Thom</u>as: "Dost thou not believe that I am <u>ris</u>en from the dead? Bring thy <u>hands</u> here, and <u>touch</u> My side! Be no longer an unbe<u>liev</u>er! Proclaim My Passion and My Resur<u>rec</u>tion to all, that <u>eve</u>ryone may join in thy cry:// 'My Lord and my <u>God</u>, <u>glory</u> to Thee!'"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 6

When the doors were shut, Jesus came to His Dis<u>ciples</u>. The Apostle Thomas, by divine dispensation, was <u>not</u> with them, for he <u>spoke</u> these words: "Unless I see the <u>Mas</u>ter myself, unless I see His side flowing with baptismal blood and <u>wa</u>ter, unless I see those wounds, which have <u>healed</u> all mankind, unless I see not a spirit, but flesh and bones, I will <u>not</u> believe." Glory to <u>Thee</u>, O Lord, for Thou didst confirm <u>Thom</u>as in faith,// and hast trampled <u>death</u> by death!

APOSTICHA Tone 4

O most glorious <u>won</u>der! Doubt bore <u>cer</u>tain faith! <u>Thom</u>as said: "Unless I see, I shall <u>not</u> believe!" By touching His side, he blessed the incarnate Son of God, Who had <u>suf</u>fered in the flesh, and he proclaimed the resur<u>rec</u>ted God,// crying out with joy: "My Lord and my <u>God</u>, <u>glory</u> to Thee!"

V. Praise the Lord, O Jerusalem! Praise thy God, O Zion!

O most glorious <u>won</u>der! Thomas placed his hand on the fiery side of Jesus <u>Christ</u> our God! <u>He</u> was not <u>scorched</u> by this, but his doubt changed to certain faith, and he cried <u>fer</u>vently: "Thou art my <u>Mas</u>ter <u>and</u> my God.// Glory to Thee, Who art <u>ris</u>en from the dead!"

V. For He strengthens the bars of thy gates; He blesses thy children within thee!

O most glorious <u>won</u>der! John the Apostle leaned on the <u>Saviour</u>'s breast, and <u>Thom</u>as was made worthy to <u>touch</u> His side. The one thus understood the depths of the<u>ol</u>ogy, while the other was privileged to announce the mystery of the Resur<u>rec</u>tion to us,// crying: "My Lord and my <u>God</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!"
