The Reader continues with Psalm 103, as usual.

Hear me, O Lord!

Tone 5

Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! Re<u>ceive</u> the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon Thee!//

<u>Let my prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.

Tone 5 (for the Resurrection)

By Thy <u>pre</u>cious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, Thou hast put the <u>dev</u>il to shame. By Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion, Thou hast blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin and <u>saved</u> us from the <u>gates</u> of death.// We glorify Thee, O only-begotten One.

The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

Christ was led as a sheep to the slaughter

in order to grant Resurrection to the human race.

The princes of hell were frightened by this,

for the gates of sorrow were lifted.

Christ the King of glory had entered.

saying to those in chains: "Go forth!"//

And to those in darkness: "Come to the light!"

Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Tone 2 (For the Blind Man: from the Pentecostarion)

The man blind from birth asked himself:

"Was I born blind because of my parents' sins?

Or am I a living sign of the people's <u>faith</u>lessness?

I am not content to continue asking whether it is <u>night</u> or day.

My feet can no longer endure tripping on the stones.

I have seen <u>nothing</u>: neither the sun shining, nor the image of my <u>Maker.//</u>

But I entreat Thee, O Christ God, look upon me and have mercy on me!"

If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.

Repeat: The man blind from birth ...

For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Jesus, passing by the Temple, met a man <u>blind</u> from birth.

He had compassion on him and put spittle on his eyes,

saying: "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam!"

He washed himself and then gave glory to God.

His neighbours asked him:

"Who opened thine eyes, which no one could heal before?"

He cried out: "A man called Jesus said to me:

'Wash in Siloam!' and now I see;

He is <u>truly</u> the Christ, the Messiah Whom Moses fore<u>told</u> in the Law.//

He is the Saviour of our souls!"

From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 8 (For the Forerunner)

O blessed John the Forerunner,

thy head didst shine from the ground with rays brighter than the sun.

It enlightens the faithful.

We have it as a divine treasure

and draw rich grace from it,

sanctifying our souls, our bodies and thoughts.//

As we celebrate, we call thee blessed.

For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Thy holy head, O blessed Forerunner,

poured out abundant grace.

It was shown without his foreknowledge to the priest who was wise in God.

He quickly went with faith and grace

and openly brought about its manifest appearance,

which sanctified the emperor and the divinely wise people,//

who fervently maintain the Orthodox Faith.

Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

We celebrate the third revelation of thy precious head.

crowned by the Holy Trinity.

which was severed, O glorious one, because of thy godly zeal.

The ranks of Angels, the company of martyrs,

the Apostles of God and all the Prophets

rejoice in its discovery.//

Together with them, ever remember us, O Forerunner of the Lord!

For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Tone 6 (For the Forerunner)

Thy head is a treasury of godly gifts, O <u>Fore</u>runner. Guarded safely by God, it came to light from the <u>hol</u>lows of the earth. With faith we gain possession of it, O glorious <u>Bap</u>tist of Christ. As we venerate it, we are en<u>riched</u> through thee with the wonders of <u>miracles</u>,// and in the forgiveness of transgressions.

Tone 5 (For the Blind Man: from the Pentecostarion)

Passing by the way, O Lord,

Thou didst meet a man blind from birth.

Thy Disciples were puzzled and asked:

"Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered: "It was not that this man sinned, or his <u>parents</u>, but that the works of God might be revealed in him.

I must <u>work</u> the works of Him Who sent me, which no one <u>else</u> can do." As He said this, He spat on the ground and made clay of the <u>spit</u>tle, and a<u>noint</u>ed the man's eyes with the clay and <u>said</u> to him:

"Go, wash in the pool of Siloam!"

He went and washed, and was made whole, crying: "Lord, I believe!"// He worshipped Thee, and we cry: "Have mercy on us!"

OLD TESTAMENT READINGS

The Reading from the Prophecy of Isaiah.

[Chapters 40, 41, 45, 48, 54]

Thus saith the Lord: "Comfort, comfort My people," says God. "Speak to the heart of Jerusalem, ye priests, comfort her, for her humiliation is increased, her iniquity is pardoned; for she has received from the Lord's hand double for her sins. The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare ye the way of the Lord; make straight the paths of our God.' "Go up to a high mountain, you who are proclaiming glad tidings to Zion, lift up your voice with strength, O herald of good tidings to Jerusalem. Lift it up, fear not! I the Lord God, I have heard the poor of Israel and will not forsake them. I will open rivers on the mountains, and fountains in the midst of the valleys; I will make the deserts pools of water, and the thirsty land springs of water. Let the heavens rejoice from above, and let the clouds rain down righteousness; let the earth bring forth, and let it sprout forth mercy and cause righteousness to shine forth also. "Declare this with a shout of joy, and let this be known, proclaim it to the end of the earth. Say, 'The Lord hath redeemed his servant Jacob!' And if they thirst, He shall lead them through the desert, He shall bring forth water for them out of the rock. Rejoice, O barren one who did not bear; break forth into singing and cry aloud, you who have not been in travail! For more are the children of the desolate one than of her who hath a husband."

The Reading from the Prophecy of Malachi.

[Chapters 3, 4]

Thus saith the Lord Almighty: "Behold, I send My messenger before thy face, who shall prepare thy way before thee, and the Lord whom ye seek, shall come into His temple. But who can endure the day of His coming? For He is coming like the fire of a furnace and like the fuller's herb; and He shall cleanse, refining and purifying, as it were, silver and gold. And He comes to you with judgment, and will be a swift witness against the evil ones and against adulterers, and against those who swear falsely by My name, against those who withhold the hireling's wages, against those who oppress widows and beat orphans, against those who avoid judgment in favour of strangers, and against those who do not fear Him," saith the Lord Almighty. "For I am the Lord your God, and I change not; and you, the sons of Jacob, have turned aside from the Law and have not kept it. Return to me, therefore, and I will return to you," saith the Lord Almighty. "And all nations shall call you blessed, and they shall understand that I am the Lord, who distinguishes between the righteous and between the transgressors on that day, in which I shall act to spare those who love Me. "Know, therefore, and remember the Law of Moses, my servant, as I commanded you at Horeb, the statutes and ordinances for all Israel. And behold, I will send to you Elijah the Tishbite before the great and glorious day of the Lord comes, who shall turn the heart of a father to his son, and the heart of a man to his neighbour, lest I come quickly and smite the earth," saith the Lord Almighty, God, the Holy One of Israel.

The Reading from the Wisdom of Solomon.

[Chapters 4, 5]

The righteous man, though he die early, will be at rest. The righteous man who has died will judge the ungodly who are living. For they will see the end of the righteous, and will not understand what was said about him; for the Lord will cast down the ungodly speechless to the ground and shake them from the foundations; they shall become desolate to the end; they will be in sorrows, and their memory will perish. For they will come with fear at the thought of their sins, and their iniquities shall stand against them to convict them. Then the righteous man will stand with great boldness before those who have afflicted him, and those who have made of no account his labours. Having seen it, they shall be troubled with much fear and they will be amazed at his most-glorious salvation. They will say within themselves in repentance, in anguish of spirit. They will groan and say: "This was he whom we had sometimes in derision and a proverb of reproach—we fools! We accounted his life as madness, and his end to be without honour. How is he numbered among the sons of God? And why is his lot among the Saints? "Therefore, we have erred from the way of truth, and the light of righteousness did not illumine us, nor did the sun shine on us. We took our fill of the paths of lawlessness and destruction, and we walked impassible pathways, but the way of the Lord we have not known."
