Possessing victory over <u>hell</u>, O Christ, since Thou art <u>free</u> among the dead, Thou didst as<u>cend</u> the Cross raising with Thyself those who sat in the <u>shades</u> of death.// Drawing life from Thy light, O almighty Saviour, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

In Thy Cross, we <u>glo</u>ry, O Christ. We sing and glorify Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion, for <u>Thou</u> art our God,// and we know no <u>oth</u>er than Thee.

If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.

Tone 6 (For the Feast)

As the Cross is <u>lift</u>ed on high, it urges all of cre<u>at</u>ion to praise the undefiled Passion of Christ, Who was lifted <u>up</u> on it. For by the Cross He killed the one who <u>killed</u> us, and brought us back to life when <u>we</u> were dead. He adorned us in <u>beau</u>ty, and in His compassion made us worthy to live in <u>heav</u>en. Therefore we rejoice and ex<u>alt</u> His Name,// and magnify His infinite condescension.

For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Repeat: As the Cross is lifted on high ...

From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Moses prefigured thee, O <u>pre</u>cious Cross, when he stretched out his <u>hands</u> on high, and put the tyrant <u>Amalek</u> to flight.

Thou art the boast of the faithful, the support of those who <u>suf</u>fer, the glory of the Apostles, the champion of the <u>Right</u>eous, and the preservation of <u>all</u> the Saints.

Therefore, beholding thee <u>raised</u> on high, creation rejoices and <u>cel</u>ebrates, glorifying Christ Who has joined together through thee that which was di<u>vid</u>ed// in His infinite goodness.

For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Repeat: Moses prefigured thee, O <u>pre</u>cious Cross ...

Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

O most <u>ven</u>erable Cross, attended by ranks of rejoicing <u>angels</u>, as thou art exalted today at the di<u>vine</u> command, thou dost lift <u>up</u> again all those who through the <u>sto</u>len food had been cast out and were <u>sunk</u> in death. Therefore, as we venerate thee in faith with <u>heart</u> and lips, we draw sanctification from thee and <u>cry</u> aloud: "Exalt Christ, the God transcendent in <u>good</u>ness,// and venerate His divine footstool!"

For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Repeat: 0 most venerable Cross ...

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 2 (For the Feast)

Come, all you <u>na</u>tions, let us fall down in worship before the <u>bless</u>ed Tree, by <u>which</u> eternal justice has <u>come</u> to pass! For he who deceived <u>Ad</u>am by a Tree is caught by the <u>lure</u> of the Cross; and <u>he</u> who held under his tyranny the creature endowed by God with royal <u>dig</u>nity is brought down in a headlong fall.

The serpent's venom is washed away by the blood of God,

and the <u>curse</u> of just condemn<u>ation</u> is undone

when the Just One is condemned by an unjust judgment.

For it was fitting that the tree should be healed by a Tree,

and that by the Passion of the passionless God

what was wrought on the Tree should destroy the passions of man, who was condemned.

But glory to Thy dread dispensation for our sakes, O Christ the King,

through which Thou hast saved us all,//

since Thou art good and the Lover of man!

Now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.
