(9) The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

Thou didst en<u>dure</u> the Cross and <u>bur</u>ial for our sake. By Thy <u>death</u>, Thou didst destroy <u>death</u> as God. We fall <u>down</u> before Thy Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day,// O <u>Saviour</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!

Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

When the A<u>pos</u>tles beheld the Resurrection of the <u>Maker</u>, they were a<u>mazed</u> and sang the an<u>gel</u>ic praise.

<u>This</u> is the <u>glory</u> of the Church.

<u>This</u> is the richness of the <u>Kingdom.//</u>
O Lord, crucified for our <u>sake</u>, <u>glory</u> to Thee!

Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Thou wast <u>held</u> by lawless <u>men</u>, O Christ, but to <u>me</u>, Thou art God, and I am <u>not</u> ashamed. Thou wast <u>smit</u>ten on the cheek, but I do not de<u>ny</u> Thee. Thou wast <u>nailed</u> to the Cross and I do not con<u>ceal</u> it, for I <u>glo</u>ry in Thy Resurrection: Thy <u>death</u> is my life.// O almighty Lord and Lover of <u>man</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!

If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.

Ful<u>fill</u>ing the prophecy of <u>Da</u>vid, <u>Christ</u> manifested His greatness in Zion to the dis<u>ci</u>ples. He is <u>praised</u> and always <u>glo</u>rified, together with the Father and the Holy <u>Spir</u>it. At <u>first</u> as the Word, He was <u>bod</u>iless, but <u>then</u> He took flesh and was <u>slain</u> for our sake.// He rose in power as the Lover of man!

For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Thou didst des<u>cend</u> into hell as Thou didst <u>will</u>, O Christ, over<u>throwing</u> death as God and rising on the third day as <u>Mas</u>ter! With Thy<u>self</u> Thou didst raise Adam from the bonds of hell and from cor<u>rup</u>tion!// Glory to Thy Resurrection, O only Lover of man!

From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 4 (for Venerable Chariton)

By abstinence and fervent prayer, O venerable <u>Char</u>iton, thou didst cause thy body's passions to <u>with</u>er.
With streams of <u>tears</u> thou didst drown the deceitful serpent, O <u>bless</u>ed one. In great measure thou wast well-<u>pleas</u>ing to God.

With the sweat of thy struggle, O truly <u>won</u>drous one, thou didst quench the burning fire of the <u>passions</u>. Thou didst <u>bear</u> the fire of harsh wounds and <u>tor</u>tures, confessing before evil tyrants the condescension of the in<u>car</u>nate Word. Thou wast a witness for Him, adorned with wounds from thy <u>man</u>ifold <u>tor</u>ments,// O most blessed, God-bearing <u>Char</u>iton.

For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

O most sacred and blessed <u>Char</u>iton, thou didst flee into the mountains and <u>des</u>erts. Pre<u>serving</u> thy soul undefiled, thou wast revealed to be a dwelling of the <u>Trin</u>ity, in Whose power thou didst found monasteries and holy <u>dwellings</u> for the building up and sal<u>va</u>tion of mo<u>nas</u>tics,// who honour thy holy memory, O <u>blessed</u> one.

Tone 4 (for Venerable Chariton)

O God-bearing <u>Char</u>iton, even after death, thou dost live in the <u>heav</u>ens in Christ. OLD TESTAMENT READINGS

The Reading from the Wisdom of Solomon

[5:15-6:3]

The righteous live for evermore; their reward also is with the Lord, and the care of them is with the Most High. Therefore shall they receive a glorious kingdom, and a beautiful crown from the Lord's hand: for with His right hand shall He cover them, and with His arm shall He protect them. He shall take to Him His jealousy for complete armour, and make the creature His weapon for the revenge of His enemies. He shall put on righteousness as a breastplate, and true judgment instead of a helmet. He shall take holiness for an invincible shield. His severe wrath shall He sharpen for a sword, and the world shall fight with Him against the unwise. Then shall the right aiming thunderbolts go abroad; and from the clouds, as from a well-drawn bow, shall they fly to the mark. And hailstones full of wrath shall be cast as out of a stone bow, and the water of the sea shall rage against them, and the floods shall cruelly drown them. Yea, a mighty wind shall stand up against them, and like a storm shall blow them away: thus iniquity shall lay waste the whole earth, and ill dealing shall overthrow the thrones of the mighty. Hear, therefore, O ye kings, and understand; learn, ye that be judges of the ends of the earth. Give ear, ye that rule the people, and glory in the multitude of nations. For power is given you of the Lord, and sovereignty from the Most High.

The Reading from the Wisdom of Solomon

[3:1-9]

The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and there shall no torment touch them. In the sight of the unwise they seemed to die: And their departure is taken for misery, and their going from us to be utter destruction: But they are in peace. For though they be punished in the sight of men, yet is their hope full of immortality. And having been a little chastised, they shall be greatly rewarded: For God proved them, and found them worthy for Himself. As gold in the furnace hath He tried them, and received them as a burnt offering. And in the time of their visitation they shall shine, and run to and fro like sparks among the stubble. They shall judge the nations, and have dominion over the people, and their Lord shall reign forever. They that put their trust in Him shall understand the truth: And such as be faithful in love shall abide with Him: For grace and mercy is to His saints, and He hath care for his elect.

The reading from the Wisdom of Solomon.

[4:7-15]

Though a righteous man may die before his time, he shall be at rest. For old age is not honoured for its length of existence, nor measured by its number of years; but discernment is grey hair for mankind, and a spotless life is the maturity of old age. There was once a man pleasing to God and loved by Him, and while living among sinners he was taken up. He was caught up lest evil change his understanding or deceit deceive his soul. For envy arising from lack of judgment obscures what is good, and a whirling of desire undermines an innocent heart. He was made perfect, for in a short time he fulfilled long years, for his soul was pleasing to the Lord; therefore, He took him early from the midst of evil. Yet peoples saw this but did not understand, nor take such a thing to heart, that the Lord's grace and mercy are with His elect and that He watches over His holy ones.
