"LORD I CALL..." Tone 4

Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call upon</u> Thee!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.

Tone 4 *(for the Resurrection)*

We glorify Thy Resurrection on the third day, O <u>Christ God</u>, by always honouring Thy <u>life-creating Cross</u>; by <u>it</u>, Thou hast renewed the corrupted <u>na</u>ture of man, O al<u>mighty One</u>.

By it, Thou hast renewed our <u>en</u>trance to <u>hea</u>ven,// for Thou art good and the Lover of man.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

Thou didst loose the Tree's verdict of disobedience, O <u>Saviour</u>, by being voluntarily nailed to the <u>tree</u> of the Cross. By de<u>scending</u> to hell, O al<u>mighty</u> God, Thou didst break the <u>bonds</u> of death. Therefore, we adore Thy Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, <u>singing</u> in joy:// "Glory to Thee, O all-<u>pow</u>erful Lord!"

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Thou didst smash the gates of <u>hell</u>, O Lord, and by Thy death Thou didst demolish the <u>king</u>dom of death. Thou didst de<u>liv</u>er the race of men from cor<u>rup</u>tion,//granting the world life, incorruption and great <u>mercy</u>.

V. (7) Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Come, O <u>peo</u>ple, let us sing of the Saviour's Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day! By <u>it</u>, we have been freed from the unbreakable <u>bonds</u> of hell. By it, we have received life and incor<u>rup</u>tion. Save us by Thy <u>Res</u>ur<u>rec</u>tion!//
O Life-creating and almighty Saviour, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee!

V. (6) If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.

Tone 1 *(for the Forefeast*

By thy <u>birth</u>, O <u>Pure</u> One, beams of joy shine on all the <u>u</u>niverse, an<u>nouncing</u> Christ our <u>God</u> to all. He is the <u>Sun</u> of <u>glo</u>ry. Thou wilt give <u>birth</u> to <u>Him</u> for us;// He brings us gladness, <u>grace</u> and truth.

V. (5) For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

We an<u>ticipate</u> thy glorious feast, O <u>Pure</u> One. It proclaims to all the good will of our <u>Ben</u>efactor. <u>Now</u> thou hast become the <u>cause</u> of our joy, the <u>her</u>ald of <u>prom</u>ised grace// and the fruit of divine <u>glad</u>ness.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The <u>child</u> of God, the holy Theo<u>to</u>kos, the promise of the Prophets, the daughter of <u>Da</u>vid, to<u>day</u> is born from wise Joachim and <u>An</u>na. She has overthrown the <u>curse</u> of <u>Ad</u>am for us// by her holy childbearing.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 4 (for St. Sozón)

When He, Who of His own will took our weakness up<u>on</u> Himself, strengthened thy weakness with power, O <u>bless</u>ed one, thou didst run the <u>race</u> of martyrdom for His <u>sake</u> with joy. Thou didst crush the impotent enemy with thy most <u>beau</u>tiful feet. Therefore, Jesus, the Lover of mankind and <u>Saviour of</u> our souls,// has woven wreaths of <u>vic</u>tory for thee.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

When thou wast wounded, O <u>glo</u>rious one, thou didst wound thine <u>en</u>emies and <u>armed</u> with the Cross, thou didst throw them <u>down</u> to the ground. Thou wast openly arrayed in invincible <u>ar</u>mour and wast made steady by the <u>love</u> of Him Who has translated thee to the spiritual <u>king</u>doms// as an unconquered martyr and <u>heav</u>enly man!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Thou didst openly imitate the <u>Saviour</u> and Lord, Who for thy sake endured voluntary <u>sufferings</u>. Of thine own <u>will</u>, O athlete Sozón, thou <u>gavest</u> thyself to wounds and beatings and unbearable <u>tor</u>ments. Therefore, He has honoured thee with <u>heavenly</u> gifts// and revealed thee to be a source of healings for those who <u>love</u> thee.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 4 *(for the Forefeast)*

The angelic host of heaven and we <u>mor</u>tals on earth, bless thine honourable birth, O most holy <u>Virgin</u>, for thou be<u>camest</u> the Mother of Christ our God, the Creator of all. Never cease to pray to Him for us, who after God have set our <u>hope</u> on thee,//O all-praised and unwedded Theotokos!

Tone 4 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The Prophet David was a <u>fa</u>ther of the Lord through thee, O <u>Virgin</u>.

He fore<u>told</u> in songs the One Who worked <u>won</u>der in thee: "At Thy right hand <u>stood</u> the Queen,"

Thy Mother, the mediatrix of life,

since God was freely born of her without a <u>fa</u>ther.

He wanted to renew His fallen image, made corrupt in passion,

so He took the lost sheep up<u>on</u> His <u>shoul</u>der

and brought it to His Father,

joining it to the heavenly pow'rs.//

By being <u>laid</u> in the tomb Thou hast raised those who <u>dwelt</u> in the tombs, granting life and incorruption to the <u>hu</u>man race.//
Therefore in songs we glorify Thy rising on the <u>third</u> day.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.
